Room 11. Now go upstairs to the **Garderobe Chamber**

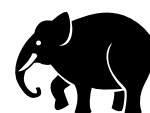
What was a Garderobe?

What do you think it may have been used for?

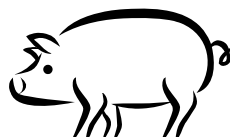
Room 14. Go through into the Small Bedchamber / Toy Room
