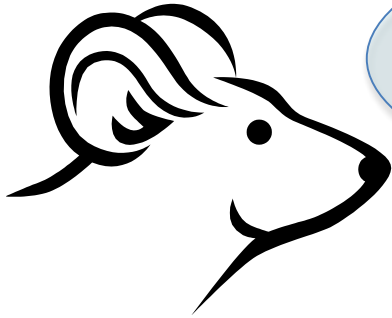


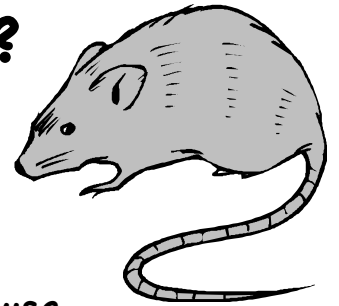
The Rat Pack's Rat Facts

It is said that you are never more than a few feet away from a rat... so keep a look out and you might find a rat in each room.

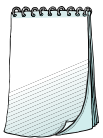


The Rat Pack will give you some nuggets of Old House knowledge and fascinating rat facts!

Here's a few clues to help you find those wriggling rodents, and tick them off when you do!

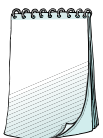


Room 1. **The Tudor Parlour**



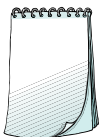
Look over by the window... can you spot a rat?

Room 2. **The Tudor Parlour Closet**



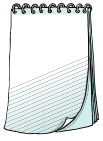
Down on the farm, this rat thinks his luck is in... he has found some tasty treats in a seed sowing machine.

Room 3. **The Porch**



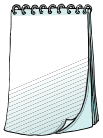
Is there a rat hiding in an old leather fire bucket?

Room 4. **The Houseplace**



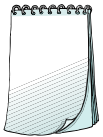
Tudor chefs might need to be careful when cooking their dinner... a ratty surprise might just fall into their pot!

Room 5. **Victorian Kitchen**



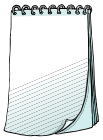
There's a rat in the kitchen what are you going to do?? Could there be a rat hiding in a cupboard in this Victorian kitchen?

Room 6. **Cellar**

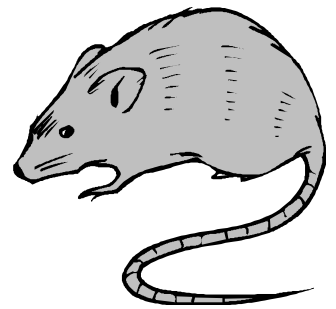


Look for a hole for cleaning out a smelly Tudor toilet... above it is a perfect hiding place for rats!

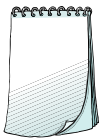
Room 7. **Garderobe Chamber**



A Tudor Toilet was called a Garderobe... could there be a rat lurking down the hole of this lovely old loo?

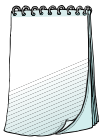


Room 8. **Central Bedchamber**



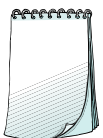
This rat is a dab hand with an old sewing machine...

Room 9. **Porch Chamber**

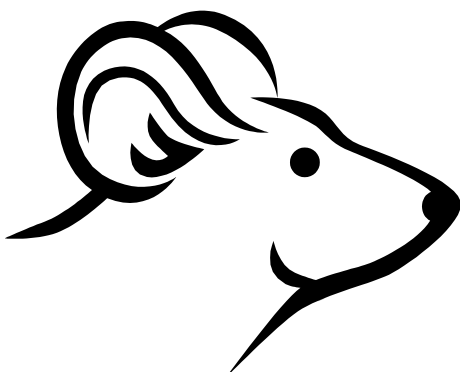


Look out for a rat taking a nap under a piece of lace.

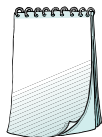
Room 10. **Small Bedchamber**



This room is rife with rats... can you spot a baby one having a ride in a chariot?

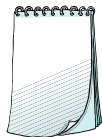


Room 11. The Solar



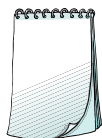
Is there a rat high up on the old beams in this room?

Room 12. The Gallery

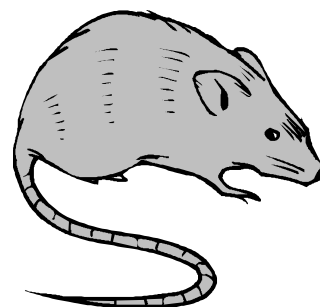


Pieces of leather used for shoemaking might make nice nesting material for a rat...
